Good Practice



Car exhausts are connected to a dedicated central exhaust system in order not to emit the exhaust gases in the area.

Malpractice



Same car maintenance shop: Food and drinks are allowed during maintenance; this is a poor practice violating the basic hygiene rules; smoking is not allowed but the smoking gear are present.

Well demarcated fluid-flow lines that facilitate identification as well as safe maintenance since it makes line-breaking easier and quicker to apply.
